Why did you apply for the alumni-funded scholarship?

I applied for this scholarship during a very difficult period in my life. After becoming homeless and estranged, I found myself overwhelmed with debt and relying heavily on credit cards just to meet my basic needs. At the same time, I was juggling long work hours with my studies, and the strain began to severely affect my mental health. With no support system of my own, and having experienced physical, financial, and emotional abuse, I was struggling to stay afloat academically and personally. I applied for the scholarship with the hope that it would relieve some of the financial burden and allow me to focus on building a future through my education.

How has the scholarship supported you this year, and what has it helped you achieve?

It helped cover essential living costs such as food, accommodation, and transport, as well as study-related expenses like books and equipment. By easing this financial strain, it allowed me to reduce my work hours and dedicate more time to my studies without constantly worrying about survival. More importantly, it gave me the mental and emotional space to focus on my health and my future goals.



What would you like to say to donors who have supported your scholarship?

I want to express my deepest gratitude to the donors who made this scholarship possible.

At a time when I felt I had no one to turn to, your support reminded me that kindness and generosity still exist in the world.

This grant was more than just financial assistance - it was a message of hope and encouragement that gave me strength to carry on. I am sincerely thankful for your generosity, which has not only helped me through this year but has inspired me to continue working hard and to one day be in a position to give back to others facing hardships.

Thank you, wholeheartedly, for believing in me when I needed it the most.

What are your next steps and future plans?

Looking forward, my ambition is to continue my academic journey into postgraduate study, either pursuing a master's in mental health followed by a PhD, or undertaking Graduate Entry Medicine. I am preparing to sit my entrance exam this coming August, and I carry with me the encouragement and faith you have shown in me.

When I started the university, I had become a care leaver so navigating independence was particularly challenging. I applied for a scholarship as I found myself aging out of the additional funding my home council had provided, and given the context of the cost-of-living crisis I was struggling quite significantly.

In addition to funding my travel costs, I have been able to purchase resources to help with my learning and continuous personal development, which has enabled me to look further into the future at my career prospects.

Without the donations in support of the Scholarships, I don't think I can truthfully say that I would still be in education. I feel that I would have been in a position where I was choosing between living and studying, and no student deserves to be placed in that position.

A BIG THANK YOU goes to everybody that believed in me. The financial assistance allows me to concentrate more on my studies rather than working full time, and I just wouldn't have been able to afford to continue to attend University without the scholarship I received.

I have used the majority of the monies for child care costs and I have used some funds to pay for parking nearer to university as I can't walk too far. Despite many challenges, I am still here at university and I am so motivated and committed to this course and in doing something that I have wanted to do for a long time.

Once qualified, I want to focus on specialising in supporting and caring for people living with dementia in the community, or to work in occupational therapy for servicemen and women, helping them address physical, psychological, and social challenges related to their service.

Thank you again for your generosity and support. Because of the opportunity you have provided me, I hope to one day give back and help other students achieve their goals, just as you have helped me.

We wanted to support students who fit the ethos of what CRYSJ was all about, community-driven, resilient and supportive of others during their educational journey. Our Academic Schools nominated final year students who they believe embody these values and are truly deserving of this prize.

With the generous donations from our Ripon and York St John community, we achieved the £2,500, and it was wonderful to celebrate and honour all our deserving recipients at the recent graduation ceremonies.


