Creative Commons Licences

What are Creative Commons Licences?

Creative Commons (CC) is a type of Open Licence dedicated to sharing knowledge and creativity, globally. It allows authors to set and control terms to their work and how it is used by others.

- There are 6 main licences with different terms and conditions.
 They are considered the "most free" (CC-BY) to the "least free" (CC-BY-NC-ND)
- All of the licences require Attribution (BY).
- CC licences can be placed on any type of work - however we recommend using an equivalent licence for computer software or hardware.

Each licence and their terms is explored below, with full information available on <u>Creative Commons</u> website.

Why use a Creative Commons Licence?

- CC licences both promote and protect an author's creativity, ensuring attribution in all uses of an original work, and in some cases an adapted work.
- The licences build confidence and compliancy of users of a work, allowing them to understand what can be done with material.
- CC licences are a requirement of most Open Access work – in this context work can be accessed freely while authors control terms and retain some (or in some cases, all) copyright.*

*Some research articles have transfer agreements with publishers. However on most occasions authors can choose a particular Creative Commons licence.

YSJU Open Access Policy and Creative Commons Licences

- Depending on the publishing route, authors may be required to select a Creative Commons licence for research articles.
- YSJU strongly recommends
 selecting the CC-BY or CC-BY-ND
 licence for research articles. This
 is to ensure eligibility for REF and
 to align with Open Access
 policies within Higher Education.
- If a Creative Commons isn't selected, it often defaults to a licence set by the publisher - it's important to be aware of any licence sections on submission points.

All use or adaptations of a CC BY-SA licensed work must be credited under **identical terms** of the original work. This licence applies to both commercial and non-commercial use.

As an **creator** of a work, the CC BY-SA licence allows your work to:

- Be shared by others
- Be adapted, remixed and built on by others
- Be created as the original creator in every use of the work.
- The creator controls the licence terms of any future adaptations.

As a **user** of a CC BY-SA licensed work you can:

- Share and distribute the work without prior permission.
- Adapt, revise the work and create new derivations as long as all derivations are clearly states (with links to the original) and licensed under identical licence terms as the original creation.

Attribution NoDerivs CC BY-ND

No Deriviations - any adaptations from a CC BY-ND work is for personal use only and cannot be shared.

The licence applies to both commercial and non-commercial use.

As an **creator** of a work, the CC BY-ND licence allows your work to:

- Be shared by others in it's original form.
- Be credited as the original creator in every use of the work.

As a user of a CC BY-ND licenced work you can:

- Share and distribute the original work without prior permission.
- Adapt and build upon the original work for personal use only—only the original work can be shared and the original creation and its creator is credited.

Attribution NonCommerical CC BY-NC

CC BY-NC licensed works are exclusively for non-commercial use.

As an creator of a work, the CC BY-NC licence allows your work to:

- Be shared by others
- Adapted, remix and built on by others for non-commercial purposes.
- Be credited as the original creator in every use or adaptation of the work.

As a **user** of a CC BY-NC licenced work you can:

- Share and distribute the work without prior permission.
- Adapt and build upon the work as long as the original creation and it's creator is credited.
- Share, publish and licence new derivatives under your own terms.



Attribution NonCommercial ShareAlike CC BY-NC-SA

All use or adaptations of work must be credited under identical terms of the original work. The licence applies exclusively to noncommercial use.

As an creator of a work, the CC BY-NC-SA licence allows your work to:

- Be shared by others for non-commercial purposes
- Adapted, remix and built on by others for non-commercial purposes
- Control the licence terms of any adaptations.

As a user of a CC BY-NC-SA licenced work you can:

- Share and distribute the work without prior permission for **non commercial purposes** only.
- Adapt, revise the work and create new, non commercial derivations as long as all derivations are clearly stated (with links to the original) and licensed under identical licence terms as the original creation.



Attribution NonCommercial NoDerivs CC BY-NC-ND

No Deriviations - any adaptations from a CC BY-NC-ND work is for personal use only and cannot be shared.

Works can be accessed and distributed but they cannot be changed in anyway. The licence applies exclusively to noncommercial use.

As an **creator** of a work, the CC BY-NC-ND licence allows your work to:

- Be shared by others on a non-commercial basis
- Be credited as the original creator in every use of the work.

As a user of a CC BY-NC-ND licenced work you can:

- Share and distribute the work without prior permission, for non-commercial purposes only.
- Use the work in it's original form only.
