

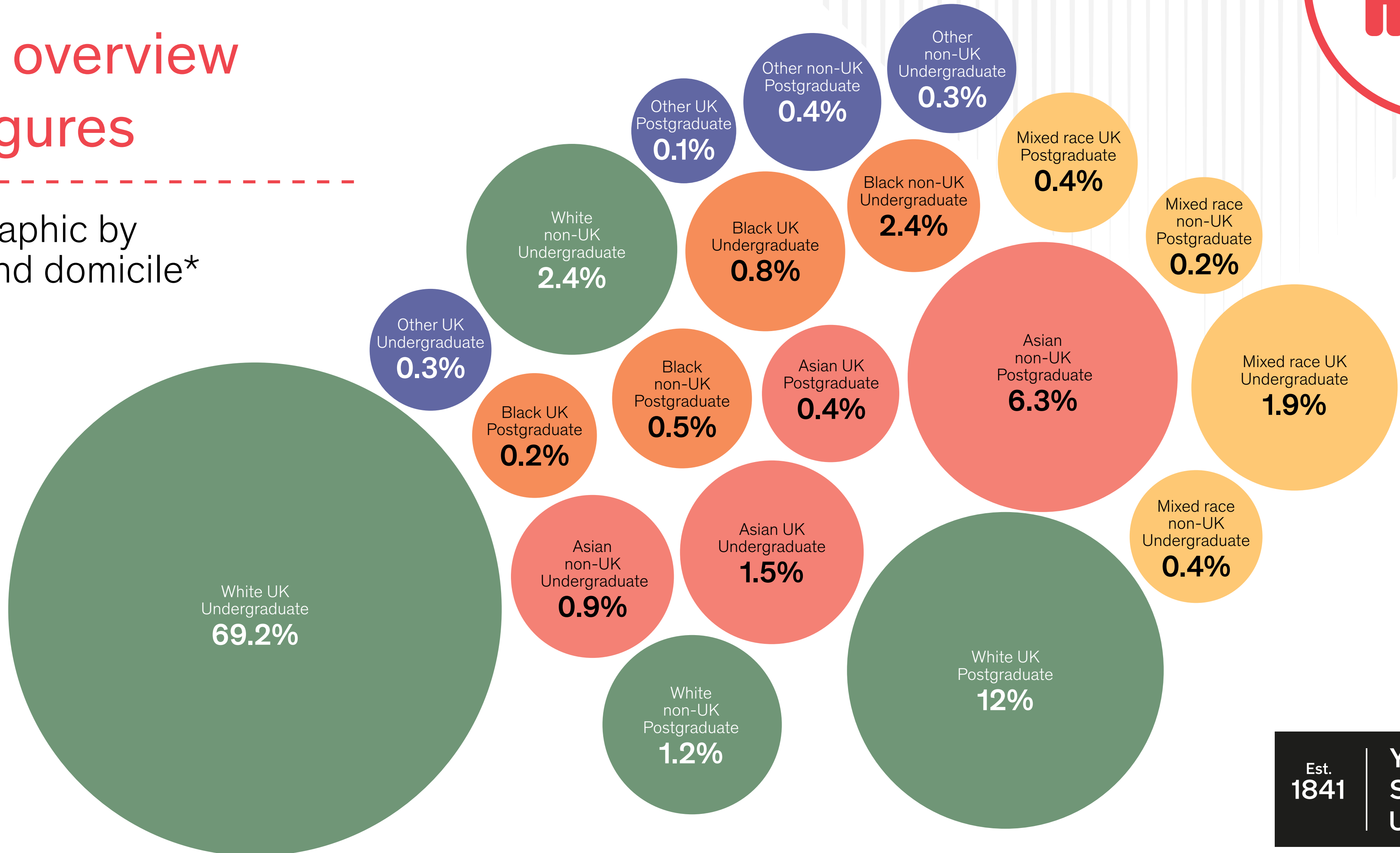

*Domicile: where the student's permanent address is/was prior to entry on their course (UK or non-UK)

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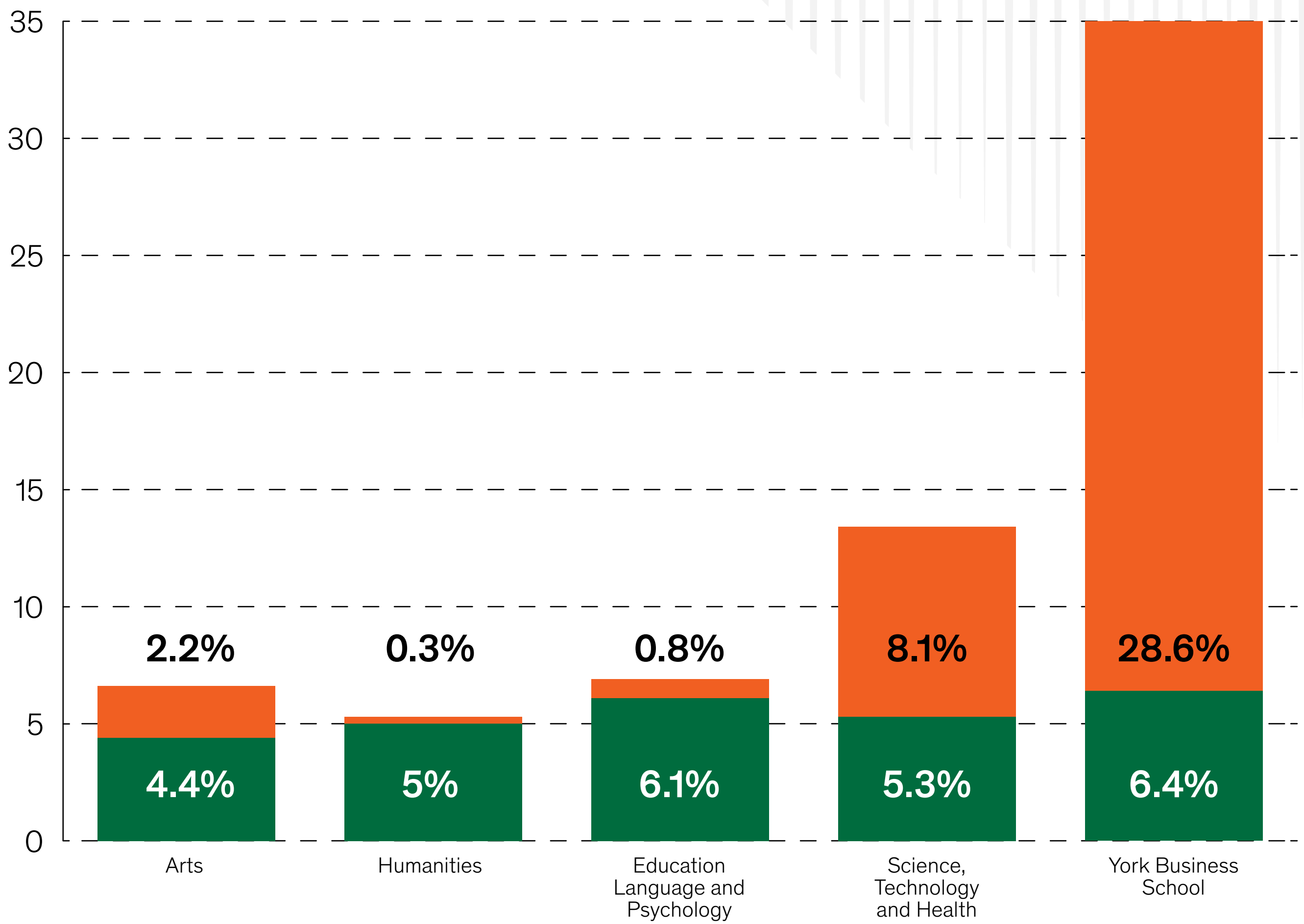


School Breakdown 2020/21 figures

BAME: Black Asian and Minority Ethnic

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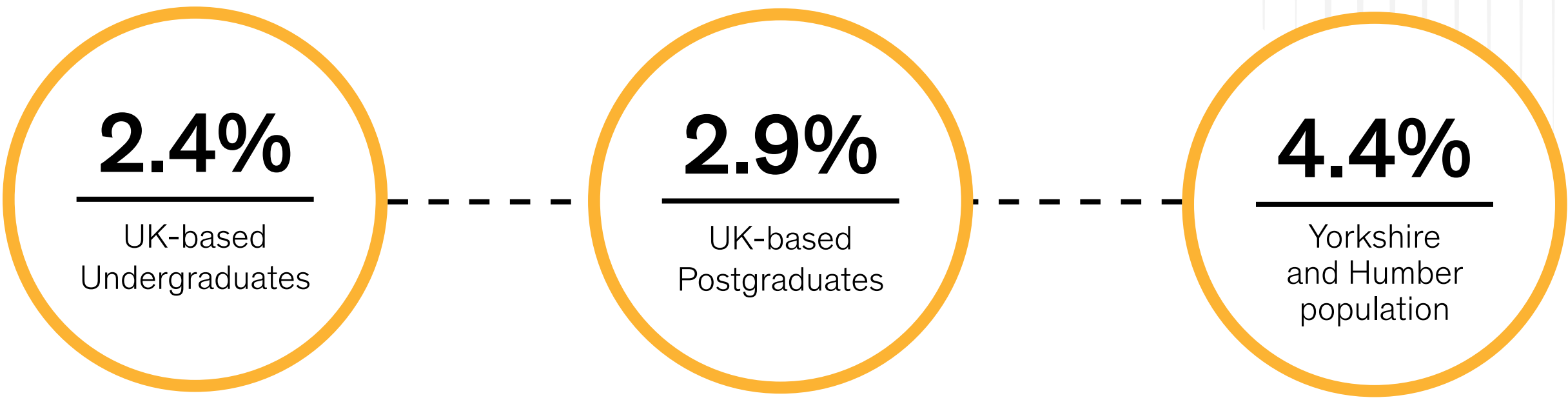

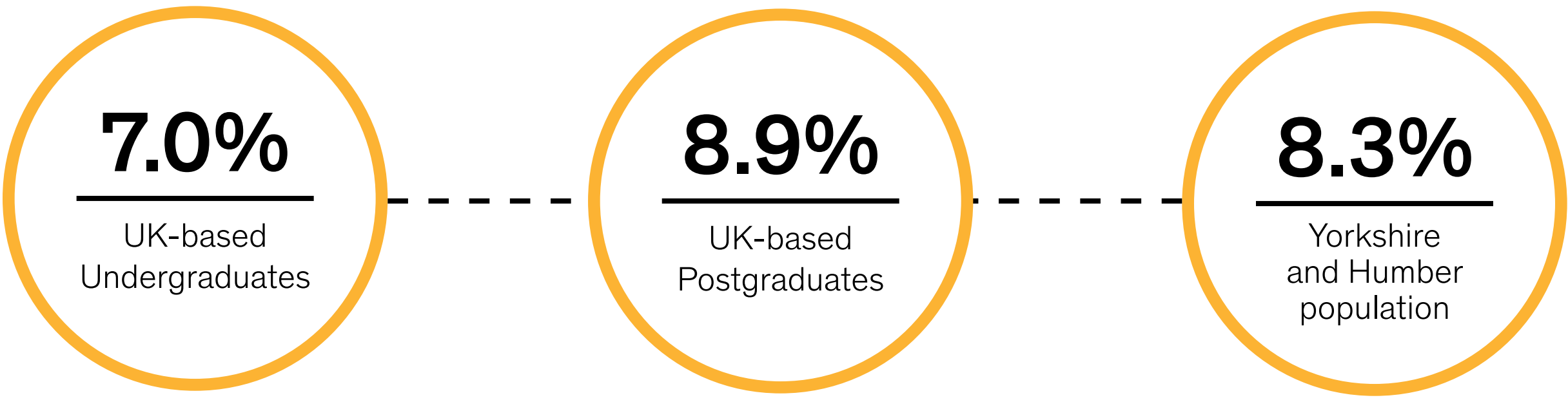
Our target is for at least 10% of UK undergraduates to be from BAME backgrounds by 2025.

1.2% of our UK undergraduate entrants for 2020/21 are Black, compared to 8.6% nationally.

BAME Entrants (including Asian)



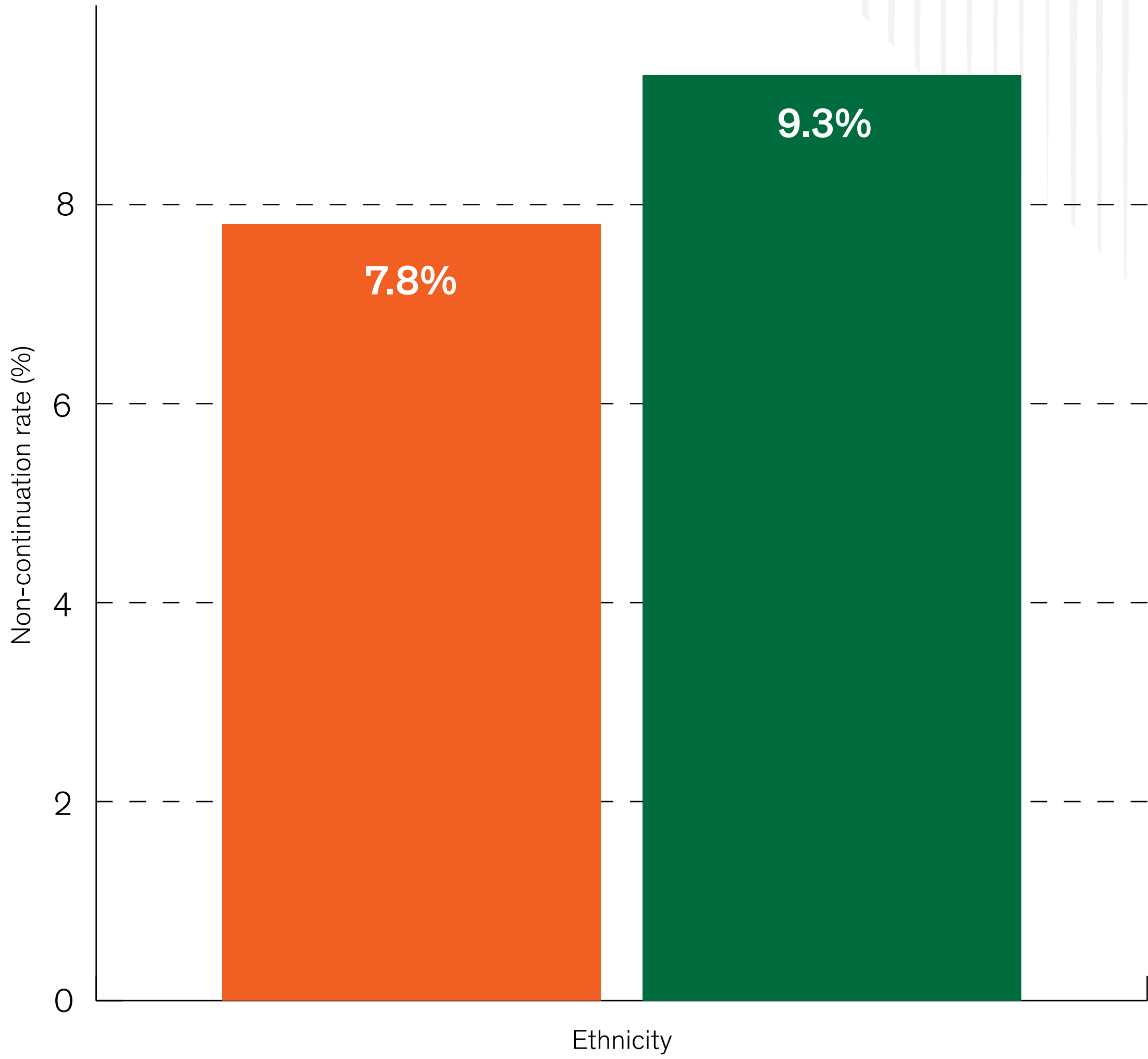


Continuation 2019/20 figures

York St John has a 1.5% differential in retention.

Our continuation rates by ethnicity are higher than the national averages for all ethnic groups except mixed ethnic groups.





Degree Award 2017/20 figures

The national average awarding gap is 13.3%. National figures for non-UK students are not available for context. While the differential between the outcomes of BAME and White students (UK) at YSJ has improved and is smaller than this, it remains unacceptable. We are committed to undertaking further work to eliminate this.

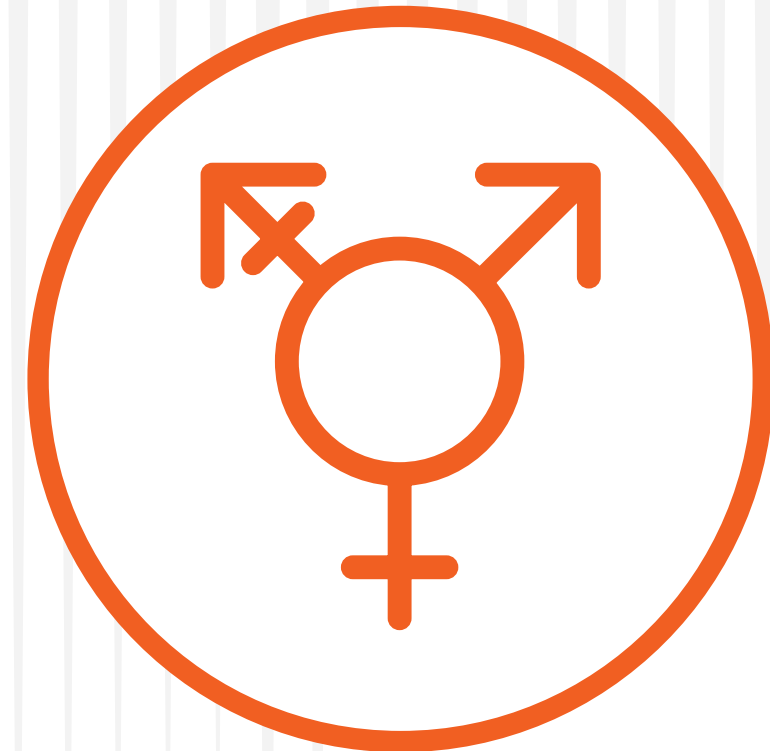

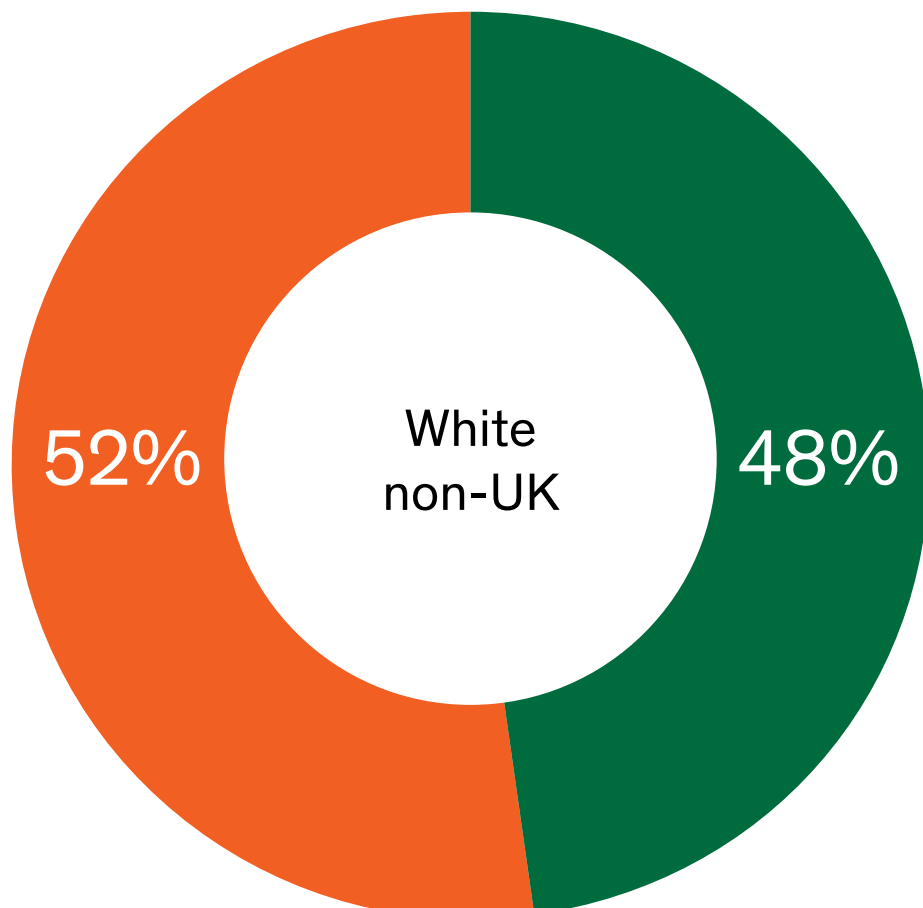
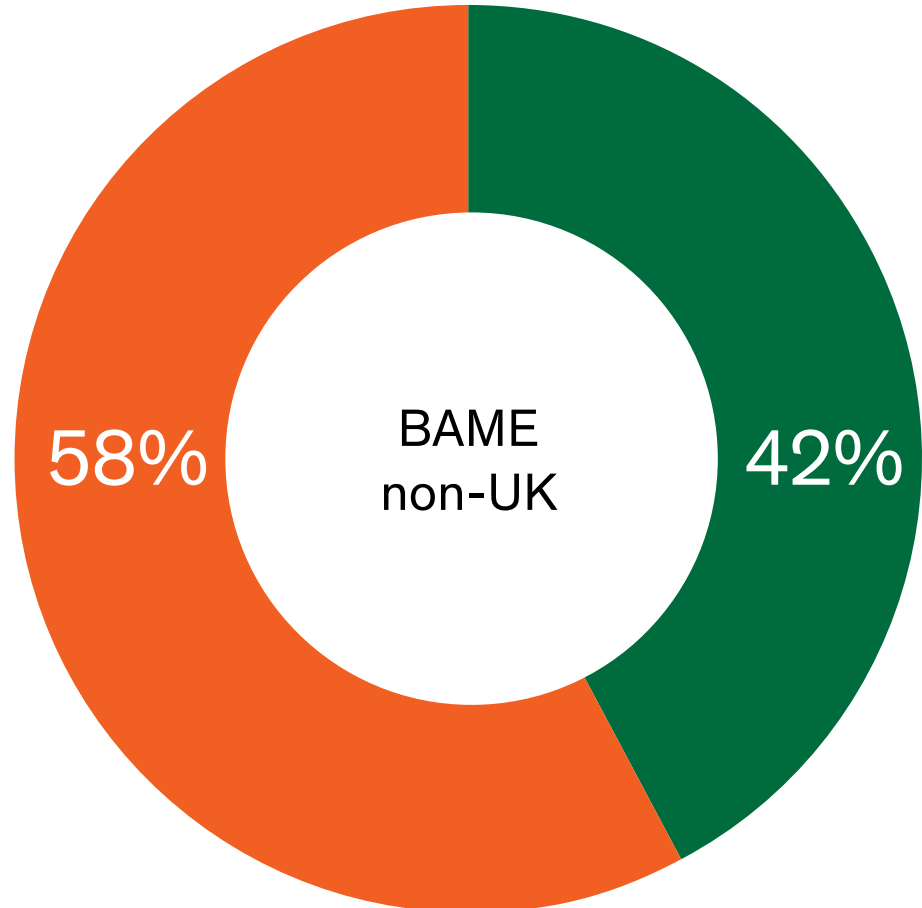
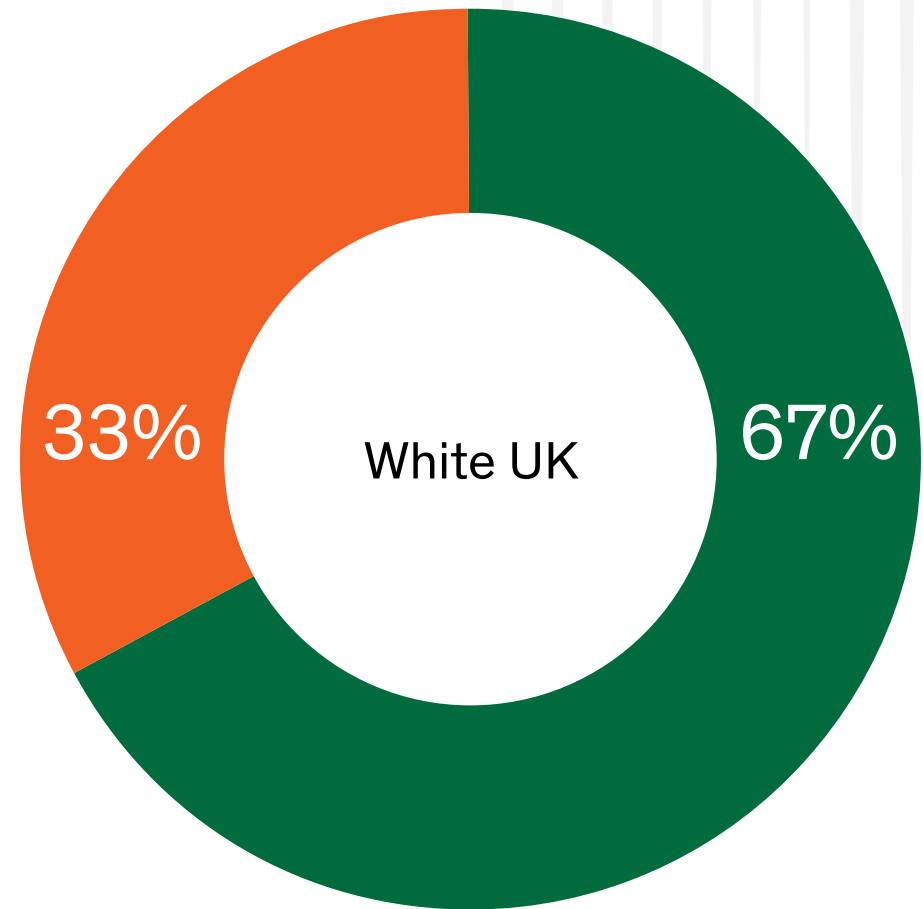
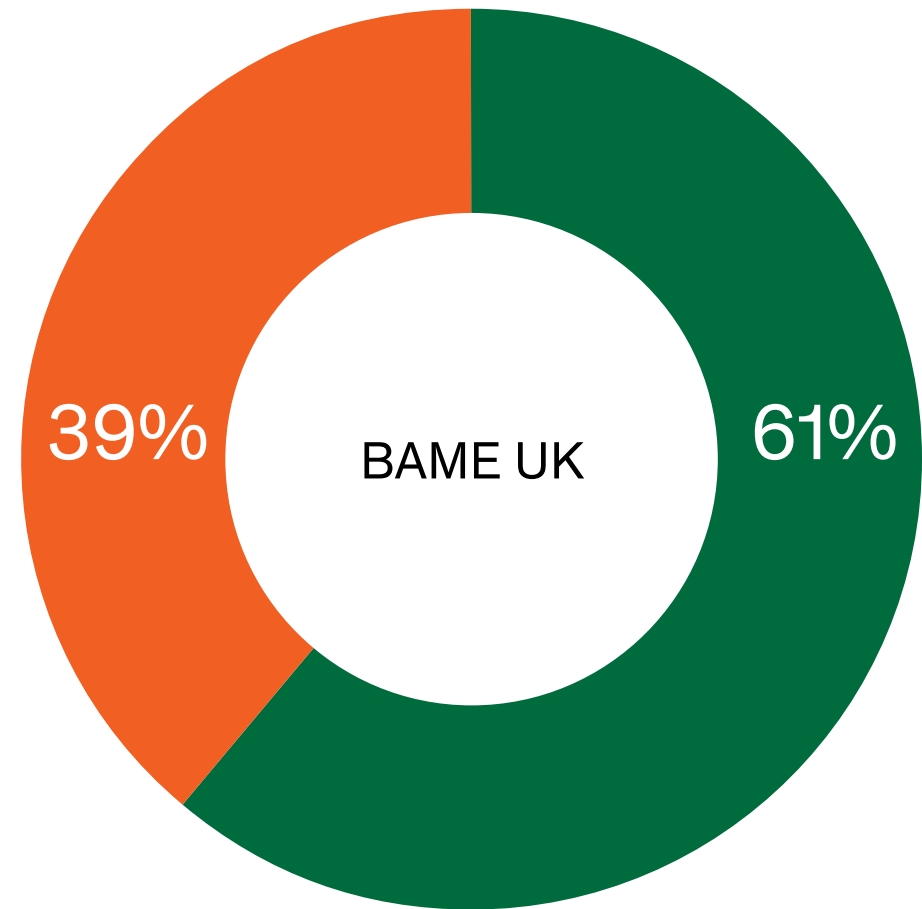
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Gender 2020/21 figures

- Male



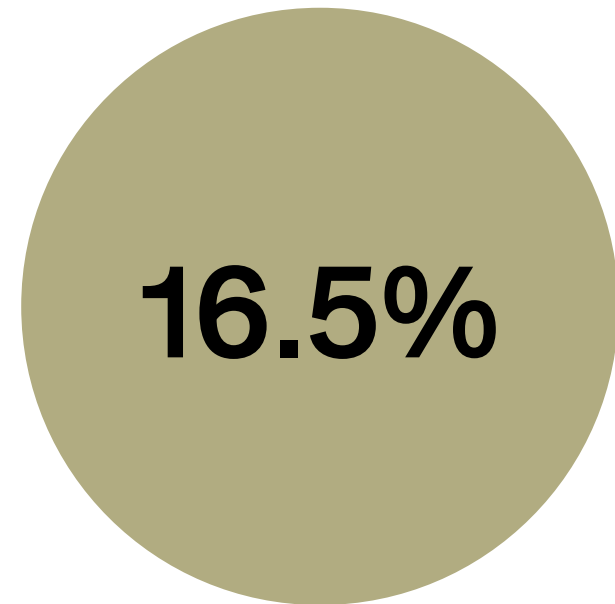
Gender is presented as a male/female binary because of how data is reported nationally. We recognise the limitations of this and do not intend to exclude the perspectives and experiences of non-binary students.



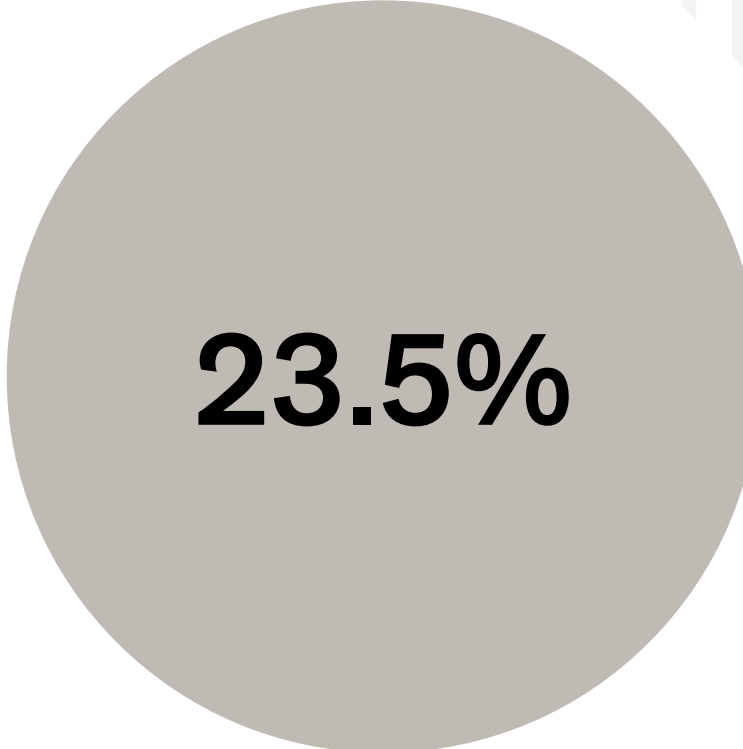
Disability 2020/21 figures

BAME undergraduates are more than **4 times as likely** as BAME postgraduates to declare they have a disability

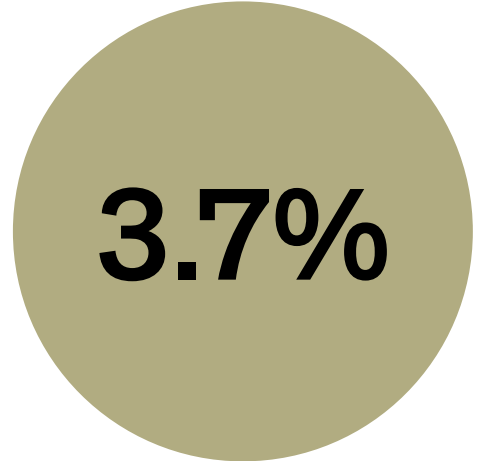
Nationally, **16% of undergraduates** and **10% of postgraduates** declare they have a disability.



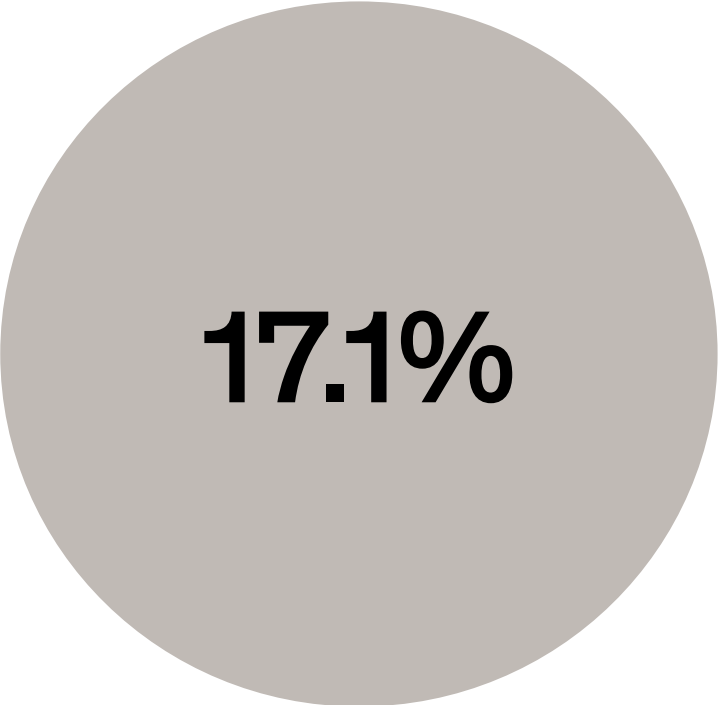
BAME undergraduates disability reporting rate
