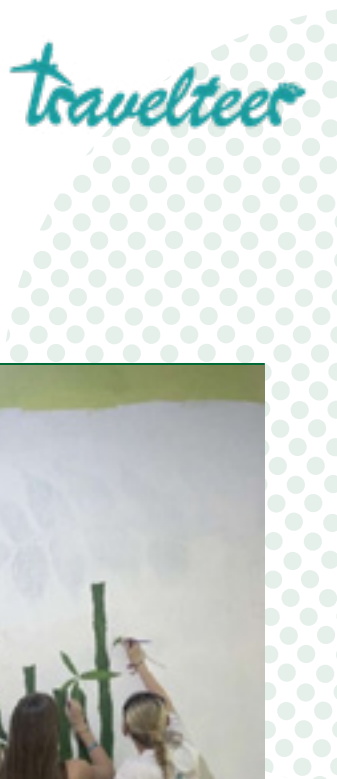

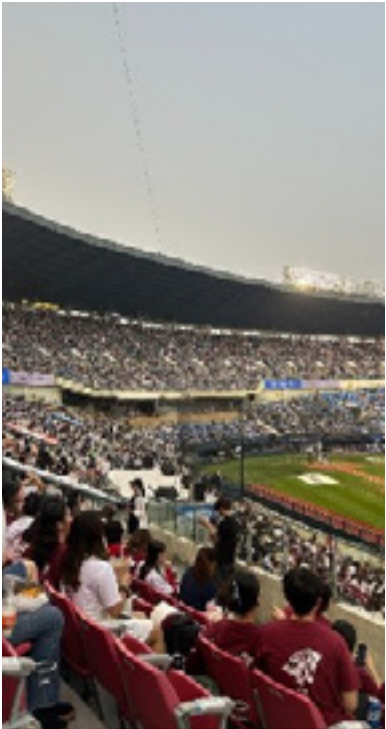

Worldwide Teaching is one of the largest English language providers in Asia. Train and teach English abroad in Thailand for 6 to 11 weeks over the Summer. Spend 4 weeks in-country earning a TEFL certificate and then for the next 7 weeks spend your time teaching in a local school whilst earning a salary! This opportunity will enable you to interact with local people, help children to reach their potential, and open you up to an array of opportunities in the future. In your free time you can immerse yourself in Thai culture, explore the country and make lifelong memories.

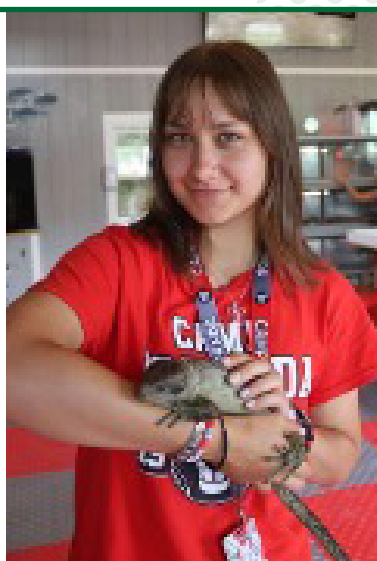

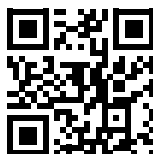

Turing Scheme Funding



The Turing Scheme is the UK government's programme to provide funding for international opportunities in education and training across the world. All projects listed in this leaflet that take place between 1st September 2024 and 31st August 2025 are eligible for Turing funding.

Priority Group Funding

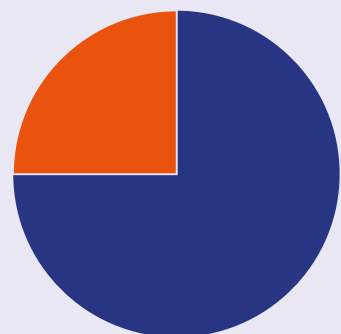
The Turing scheme prioritises the following groups for funding:

- Students with an annual household income of £25,000 or less
- Students who have caring responsibilities
- Care leavers and students who are care experienced
- Estranged students

Please note that international students are not eligible for priority group funding.

Priority Funding

What may I be eligible for if I qualify for Turing Funding?

If accepted, you will receive:

- Cost-of-living grant
- Travel grant
- Claimable readiness to travel costs: such as visa, passports, insurance, vaccines and medicals
- Any costs associated with SEND may also be refunded

Turing funding will be allocated to students based on information disclosed during the application process.

Standard Funding

What may I be eligible for if I am not in a Turing priority group?

If you do not fall within the groups mentioned above, you may still apply for funding.

If accepted, you will receive:

- Cost-of-living grant
- Any costs associated with SEND may also be refunded

Deadline for funding applications:

Early applications are strongly advised.

Applications will be reviewed monthly until there are no funded places remaining.

Turing funding will be allocated to students based on information disclosed during the application process.



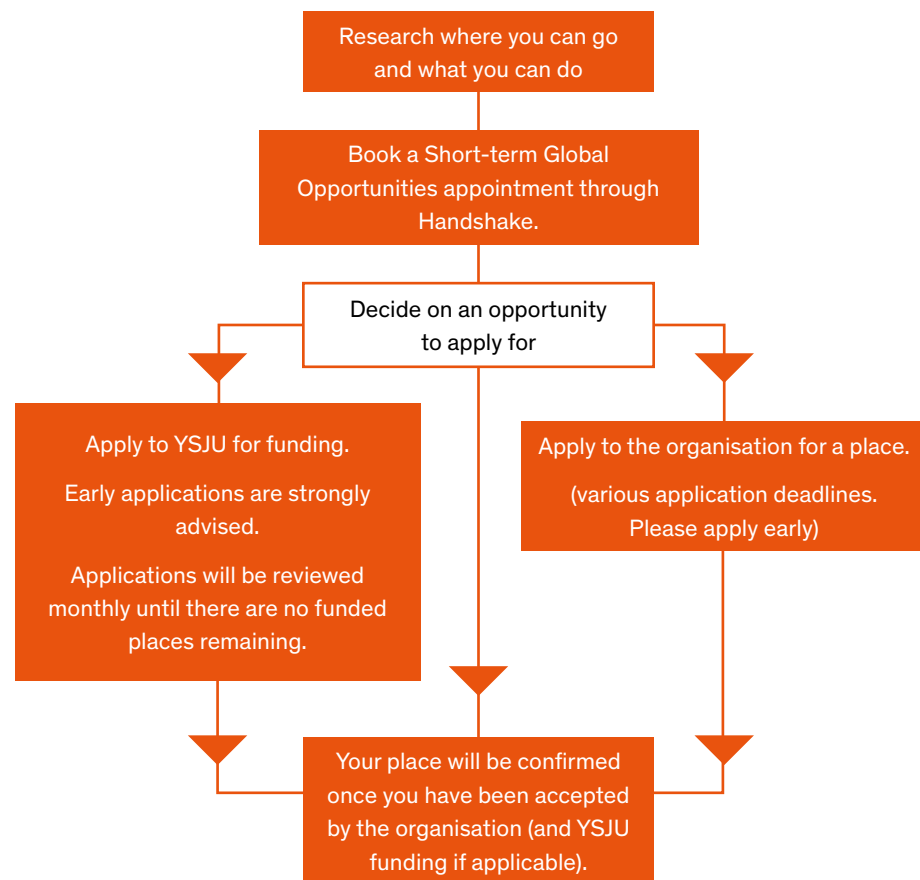
