WHAT IS STUDY ABROAD?

The Study Abroad programme is an incredible opportunity for you to spend a semester or a year of your York St John University degree studying in a different country. We have exchange agreements in place with universities all around the world that have been carefully selected for their compatibility with York St John University courses. All modules you study abroad are credit bearing and will count towards your York St John University degree.

- All students will receive a minimum grant of £750
- · Study Abroad will not add extra time to your degree
- · You will not pay tuition fees to your host institution
- You are guaranteed YSJ accommodation for the semester you are not abroad
- · All modules are delivered in English

WHAT FUNDING **CANIGET?**

All students who study abroad

University or the Turing Scheme, subject

will receive a minimum grant

of £750 from either York St John

to satisfying grant conditions.



WHAT WILL IT COST?

GRANT STUDENT MAINTENANCE LOAN

If you are in receipt of a maintenance loan, you will continue to receive this as usual when you are abroad, but may also be eligible for a higher amount, depending on your circumstances.

TUITION FEE REDUCTION: All Home students who study abroad for

a year will receive an 85% discount on 2025/26 tuition fees. Tuition fees are not payable to host institutions.

You may be able to claim back some travel expenses from your period abroad. The amount of grant depends on your household income, and covers reasonable costs incurred on travel expenses during an academic year. www.gov.uk/travel-grants-students-

SCHEME

Funded by the UK's global programme to study and work abroad

The Turing Scheme is the UK government's global programme to study and work abroad and provides funding for study around the world. If we are awarded Turing Funding for 25/26, priority will be given to the following groups:

- Students with an annual household income of £25,000 or less
- Students who have caring responsibilities
- Care leavers and students who are care experienced
- Estranged students

HOST UNIVERSITY COSTS

You should expect to pay for accommodation, meals and host university insurance, though this will vary from university to university. Some universities may charge other fees. Please visit our webpage for more information.



TRAVEL COSTS

This includes your flights, as well as travel from the airport to your host. It could also include any traveling you want to do once you are there.



VISA COSTS

Each country has its own visa requirements. Your host university will let you know if you need a visa and will contact you regarding the proces.



LIVING COSTS

Some countries have a different cost of living, which can include groceries, travel, social, events, clubs and books.



BANKING

Your home bank may charge you for using your card abroad, or for transferring money. You may wish to get an account with a UK bank that does not charge overseas transaction fees.



COURSE FEES

You may need to buy textbooks, course equipment, or pay towards course fees or course trips.



INSURANCE

It is important to take out insurance before you travel abroad, to cover any medical or travel accident and emergencies.



MOBILE PHONE

Check international charges with your provider, or or look at getting an e-sim.
