Work Placement Guidance Handbook for Employers

Work placements offer a valuable opportunity for both students and employers. Students gain practical experience, apply their theoretical knowledge, and explore potential career paths.

Employers benefit from access to skilled talent, fresh perspectives, and potential future employees. This guide provides a framework for employers to successfully host York St John University students on work placements, offering information on the placement process, employer expectations, and the support available from the university.

What is a Work Placement?

For students, a work placement is a temporary work experience that is part of their education or training. It provides a chance to gain practical experience in a real-world setting, apply theoretical knowledge, and explore potential career paths.

For employers, a placement is a role undertaken by a student in your organization temporarily to gain practical work experience. The aim of a work placement is to bridge the gap between students' academic and professional environments and provide a mutually beneficial experience for both the student and the employer.

- **Fixed-term Contract:** Employing a placement student means having a fixed-term, full-time student employee working towards your business objectives for a minimum of 9 months (40 hours weekly).

- **Cost-effective Recruitment:** We offer a complete, no-fee service to advertise your position, target candidates, and recruit your ideal student.

Work Placement Requirements

- Skilled opportunity (level 6 or 7 graduates roles)
- Paid at least National Minimum Wage and National Living Wage rates
- 9-12 months in duration
- 37 hours of work weekly (Students on a Tier 4 visa will be issued a signed placement entitlement letter to support their application)
- UK-based location

Work Placement Process for Potential Employers

- If you have offered a student a work placement, they will request documentation from you, including an offer letter with terms and conditions of employment, job description, and contact details.
- The student will upload these documents on Handshake (our Careers Platform), where our staff will review them. Once reviewed, an approval link will be sent to your mailbox to verify and approve and to complete health and safety/ employer guidelines.

- You will be issued a university confirmation of placement letter confirming the student's work hours. Students are not allowed to start their placement until they receive this letter.
- Provide the student with a full induction on responsibilities and work practices.
- Comply with country health and safety legislation.
- Ensure employer and public liability insurance is in place.
- During the placement, tutors will get in touch and visit the student at the placement location.
- You will be required to complete an attendance monitoring form once fortnightly.
